Headline:	Eligibility for Rent Assistance Relaxed
Content:	The following is issued on behalf of the Housing Authority:
	The eligibility criteria for public housing tenants to receive rent assistance is now further relaxed to benefit more families.
	The Chairman of the Housing Authority's Management and Operations Committee (MOC), Mr Chan Kam-man, today (Wednesday) said that the revised Rent Assistance Scheme (RAS) should be welcomed by tenants.
	"Under the revised scheme, tenants with rent-to-income ratio (RIR) exceeding 25 per cent or income below 50 per cent of the waiting list income limit are only required to pay half the rent," Mr Chan said.
	"Households with an income between 50 and 60 per cent of the waiting list income limit and at the same time a rent-income ratio exceeding 15 per cent may also pay half the rent," he added.
	As in the past, beneficiaries will be granted one-half rent reduction up to two years. A household who continues to receive rent assistance after two years may be required, subject to availability, to transfer to a flat with lower rent in the same district.
	On transfer, a domestic removal allowance and one month rent free period will be granted. Elderly households and households with disabled members are exempted from the requirement to move.
	Mr Chan said the scheme, first introduced in 1992 and revised in October 1995, aimed to help tenants with temporary financial difficulties by giving them rent reduction.
	"Tenants with long term financial difficulties may apply for the Comprehensive Social Security Allowance (CSSA) which includes cash assistance and a rent allowance covering the full amount of rent payable," he noted.
	"In addition to existing publicity materials, the Housing Department will step up publicity on the RAS through television and radio announcements."
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
