

# Experience Sharing in Demolition Work involved in Alternations & Additions (A&A) Works in Hong Kong

## Content Session One:

The first presentation will concentrate on how to deal with a major structure demolition in a prestige shopping mall in Causeway Bay by using of advance mechanical machine and well-planned demolition sequence under strict constraints including site and public safety, statutory regulations, dust control etc.

The second presentation will share the experience learned from some of the recent representing project cases. Good practices in performing such works by contractors with highlight on the limitations due to the special and unique nature of work and site constraint will also be discussed in the talk.

**Speaker:** **Mr. William Ng** is a member of the Chartered Institute of Building since 1993. He has got a master degree in Construction Management in 2002 in the City University of Hong Kong. Over 20 years experience in construction industry, Mr. Ng has got solid experience in various building construction project like, international school, prestige commercial building and tertiary institute; infrastructure development in PRC; maintenance contract from HK Government etc. Mr Ng recently has been involving in large scale A&A works in Causway Bay and Lok Fu which consists of demolition of RC and structural steel structure, reconstruction of RC and steel structure, fitting out and associated building services.

**Mr. Raymond Wong** is a member of the Chartered Institute of Building and the Hong Kong Institution of Engineers since early 1980s. Besides serving as a usual academic staff in the City University, Raymond Wong at the same time also commits himself intensively in various professional studies on projects involving super high-rise construction, long-span and complex structures, infrastructure projects, urban development and city studies. Other than study on local projects, Raymond has also set his footprint since the late 1990s in the study of other major cities of China including Guangzhou and Shanghai. Quite a number of professional papers have been published in these areas in various sources as part of his work outputs.
