#### Content

Preserving, renovating and revitalizing historic buildings with representing heritage value is a hot topic globally in the recent years. This trend on one hand reflects the awareness of general public towards such valuable assets with a determination to protect and pass them on for the sake of future generations. For a visionary government, it also forms part of an urban regeneration process. At the same time, it also bears certain economic meanings for private developers.

The experience so gained in this field in the international world, including China, is getting much substantiated since the last one or two decades. As one of his study focus for more than 15 years in global heritages, the speaker tries to summarize some general norms and practices that he observed in the exercising of this uprising hot topic. Representing cases from a wide variety of projects both in Hong Kong, Mainland China and the international world will be selected for illustration by the speaker in this seminar.

#### Speaker:

Mr Raymond Wong is serving as a lecturer at the Division of Building Science and Technology at the City University. Mr Wong is a member of the HKIE and the Chartered Institute of Building.

Since he joined City University in 1992, Mr Wong has undertaken a series of intensive studies of some world-renowned construction projects. These include some major infrastructure projects such as the new airport and the associated core projects, major transportation projects, as well as many mega-size building projects.

In the recent 15 years, Mr Wong has extended his study towards the urban development of some major cities of China, in particular Guangzhou, Shanghai and Chongqing, with focus on the urban planning, infrastructure development and revitalization projects in these cities.
