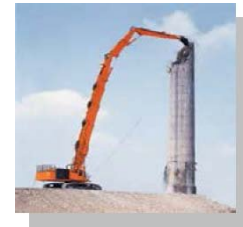

- Content** Demolition is one of the most challenging construction operations in particular for the carrying out of work within congested urban environment or handling projects of more complicated natures. During the process it may also cause huge disturbances and hazards to general public or to the nearby properties if works are not properly planned, supervised and handled. Other than that, there are also cases involving large-scale alteration-and-addition works in highly sensitive and confined environment like an operating commercial complex in which demolition forms a significant component in the project. Needless to mention those cases categorized under heritage preservation and revitalization nature where historic buildings are the main object of work.
