



## Team Marks in Mediation Part

When the Arbitral Proceedings conclude and the teams move into the mediation part the student arbitrator will become the mediator. The other two members of the arbitral tribunal will be **judges for the mediation** and **will allocated marks under the following categories in assessing teams** (both lawyer and client) in the mediation phase. Using a separate sheet they allocate marks for the mediator. Marks are allocated as follows for the Teams:

### Remarks:

The total mark is out of 50 per judge. In the interests of fairness and consistency marks should be allocated in the range of:

25-29 = low; 30-34 = average; 35-39 = good; 40-44 = very good; 45-50 = excellent.
