

## Description

The Renaissance artist, famously know for his Mona Lisa had a wide variety of interests and expertise in drawing, painting, sculpture, and as a visionary inventor, in architecture, science, music, mathematics, engineering, literature, anatomy, geology, astronomy, botany, paleontology and cartography.

Of highlight in the exhibition are Studies of a Temporary Bridge and Artillery, which offers an example of da Vinci's use of one sheet for both military and decorative studies; Trebuchet, Hammer Catapult, and Bentbeam Sling Catapult; as well as Studies for a Flying Machine, an extremely early da Vinci study for a flying machine when he was fascinated by the parallels between fish, birds, water and air, and envisioned the flying machine.

The exhibition features 12 original drawings, 1 replica of "Virgin of the Rocks", 5 machines models and 12 contemporary art pieces paying tribute to the Italian polymath's inventions and drawings.
