

# Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) in Veterinary Education – importance and potential way forward for Asia

## **Objectives and overview:**

This webinar aims to initiate a dialogue on Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) among the AAVS member institutions. DEI refers to organizational frameworks that seek to promote the fair treatment and full participation of all people, particularly groups who have historically been underrepresented or subject to discrimination based on identity or disability. The event has been designed to raise awareness of the concept and implementation of DEI in global veterinary education.

To meet these objectives, we have invited two eminent speakers, Dr Lisa Greenhill, American Association of Veterinary Medical Colleges (AAVMC), and Professor Lubna Nasir, University of Glasgow, to share their experiences and perspectives with the audience. During the webinar, we will also present the findings of a recently conducted survey regarding initiatives related to DEI among AAVS member institutions. With the help of these findings, we hope to be able to support the AAVS in identifying areas where the member institutions can benefit from each other's experiences.

## **Speaker Biographies:**

**Dr. Lisa M. Greenhill** originally joined the AAVMC in 1996 and has worked for the association on three separate occasions. Most recently, she joined the AAVMC in 2004 as the Associate Executive Director for Institutional Research and Diversity before becoming Senior Director for Institutional Research and Chief Diversity Officer. Her work primarily focuses on the ongoing development and implementation of the Diversity Matters initiative at the national and local levels as well as promoting the veterinary medical profession within underrepresented and marginalized communities. She earned a master's degree in Public Administration (with a specialization in health policy) from George Mason in Fairfax, Va. and an EdD in Higher Education Administration and Organizational Change from Benedictine University.

**Prof. Lubna Nasir** (Lub nah Nah sir) is a professor of Comparative Medicine in the School of Biodiversity, One Health and Veterinary Medicine, in the College of Medical, Veterinary and Life Science, University of Glasgow, Scotland UK. She has enjoyed a successful research career in the field of comparative oncology and teaches undergraduate Veterinary Medicine and Veterinary Bioscience students. Lubna has been leading equity, diversity and inclusion (EDI) activities within the School for almost 10 years, including acting as lead for the Schools Athena Swan charter award, an award that recognises commitment and progress towards gender equality work in higher education. She is currently Director for EDI in the School.
