

Publication:

• A research conducted by **Dr Surya Paudel** and his team in Vienna in collaboration with International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA), United Nations has been accepted for publication in the journal "Vaccine". In this work, in vitro characteristics based on the proteomics and electron microscopy, and in vivo efficacy of a novel prototype vaccine against colibacillosis in chickens is reported. The vaccine is developed based on the irradiation technology, which is the first of its kind to prevent colibacillosis, a very common disease in poultry.
