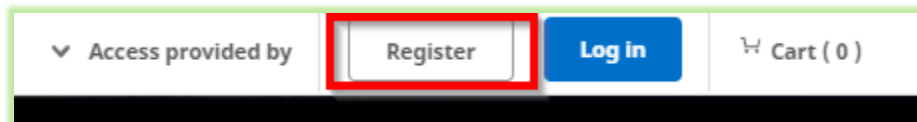



How to create a personal Cambridge Core account:

To create a personal Cambridge Core account,

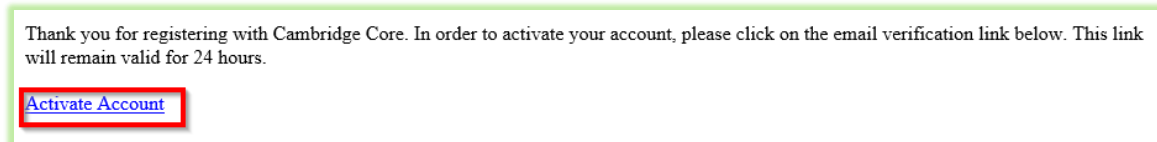
1. Go to <https://www.cambridge.org/core/>
2. Click **Register** at the top right of the page



3. Fill out the online registration form.




