#### Note:

SS5790 and SS5790B are equivalent courses. The courses are designated for students in different modes of study. These courses cannot be repeated. Once started, switching between SS5790 and SS5790B is not allowed regardless of the changes in the mode of study.

#### <u>SS5790</u>

Students of the part-time/combined study mode are required to take SS5790. The normal duration of the course is 2 semesters (Semester A & Semester B). The maximum extension duration of the course is 3 semesters (Summer term, Semester A & Semester B). After which no further extension is permitted. Each semester is charged 2.5 credits and summer term is charged 1 credit.

#### <u>SS5790B</u>

Students of the full-time study mode are required to take SS5790B. The normal duration of the course is 2 semesters (Semester B & Summer). The maximum extension duration of the course is 1 semester (Semester A). After which no further extension is permitted. Each semester is charged 2.5 credits.
