1. Keyword Syllabus

(An indication of the key topics of the course.)

- 1. A suitable supervisor will be assigned for each participant.
- 2. The project will start with problem identification. The participant is supposed to collect data to understand the existing problem of a company. Supervisor will provide guidelines in report writing, and face-to-face interview skills if necessary.
- 3. After a limited initial number of meetings with a supervisor, the participant will be encouraged to meet regularly to discuss the case or problem when necessary. In the case of client-sponsored project, meetings may take place at the client's premises.
- 4. At the early stage of the project, agreement need to be made between project supervisors, and participant about the identified problem to be investigated, the objectives of the proposed investigation, and the practical responsibility of the participants for the marshalling of research results to inform practical strategic decision making requirements.
- 5. At various meetings with the project supervisor, the participant will be expected to report what he/she has done with justifications, propose next steps, and seek advice the supervisor. Much of the discussion will centre around the actual or potential reaction of the organisation to action taken, or the possible reaction of the client to proposed suggestions.
- 6. After 4-6 months, each participant will have:
 - thoroughly analyzed the problem, drawing upon appropriate techniques and additional personal insights and expert understanding,
 - identified a solution or set of possible solutions,
 - submitted to his/her Project Supervisor a in-progress report (approximately 2,500 words) including a summary of the analysis of the problem and possible solution(s), along with a draft implementation plan.
- 7. After 8-10 months, each participant will have:
 - submitted to his/her Project Supervisor a final written report consist of about 10,000 words with a maximum of 15,000 words, excluding appendices.
