The residential workshop will be conducted on an intensive basis over a weekend to enable students to concentrate on their learning without interruptions from their daily routine commitments.

This workshop will take place in the third year after most students have completed their oral defense for research proposal and worked on their draft thesis. In the workshop, students of previous cohorts will be invited to share their experience of writing DBA thesis and preparing for the examination. In addition, students will be required to make oral presentation of their thesis and discuss with participating faculty members and students to get feedback and advice on their thesis.
