

SMOKE-FREE WORKING ENVIRONMENT

Introduction

The Council of the City University seeks the co-operation of everyone on the campus in its policy of providing a smoke-free study and work environment.

The policy is based on two assumptions :

1. that everyone on the campus is entitled to a smoke-free environment in all the areas normally used for study and work; and
2. that the implementation of the policy depends on everyone on the campus responding courteously and responsibly to the desire for a smoke-free environment.

Policy

1. There should be no smoking in any part of the teaching and administration buildings (Including tea rooms, recreation rooms and utility rooms) controlled by the University Council unless there is a clearly visible public notice designating a smoking area. There should be no smoking in any vehicles controlled by the University Council.
2. Staff who may need to smoke from time to time while working should try wherever possible to do so during tea and lunch breaks and out of doors.
3. The international no smoking symbol will be displayed in teaching and administration buildings as a reminder of the smoke-free policy.
4. Reminders will be given in Linkage twice a year to reinforce staff and student awareness of the smoke-free policy on campus.
5. The smoke-free policy is established by the authority of the Council of the City University.
