



Dr. Zhou Meixiang is an adjunct professor at City University of Hong Kong and the Chairperson of ESGilink Risk Management & Investing Co. Ltd. She has previously served as a Senior Social Development Specialist at the World Bank, Program Manager at the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP), and Deputy Director-General of the South-South Cooperation Financial Center for over 20 years. During her over thirteen years of employment at the World Bank and UNDP, she led several national and ministerial-level policy research projects in China, covering poverty alleviation, social security, and social risk management.

Dr. Zhou also participated in the implementation of over 80 projects worth more than US\$10 billion in World Bank loans, involving more than 10 sectors including energy, environmental protection, education, health, poverty alleviation, transportation, urban and rural development, science and technology, and agriculture. At UNDP, She served as a member of the UN Theme Group for Anti-Poverty, health and gender and an observer on behalf of UNDP China in the Steering Committee of a 40-million Euro China-EU social security cooperative project for 3 years. Her work focuses on inclusive and sustainable public policy research, social risk management in large investment projects, sustainable development, and project management. Her practical work spans more than 20 countries across Asia, Africa, and North America, providing her with extensive experience in multinational and cross-cultural exchanges and cooperation among governments and institutions.

Her expertise primarily lies in project management, investment and financing, social risk management, and social sustainable development policy research under the UN Sustainable Development Goals and South-South Cooperation framework, particularly in international organizations such as the World Bank, Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank, Asian Development Bank, and UN agencies.
