WANG Xun & JIN Jianlin Scholarship & Bursary Award Scheme

Regulations

Ms Ariel Xun WANG has kindly donated a number of awards to the University for eight consecutive years with effect from the 2015/16 academic year. The following regulations shall apply as of 2023/24:

- 1. The Award Scheme shall be known as the "WANG Xun & JIN Jianlin Scholarship & Bursary Award Scheme" (王珣•金建麟獎助學金).
- 2. There shall be a number of scholarships and the value of each scholarship may range from HK\$10,000 to HK\$30,000 depending on the financial needs of the applicants. The total value of scholarships distributed shall not exceed HK\$130,000 per year.
- 3. The Scholarships shall be offered to full-time UGC-funded local Year 2 or above degree students who should:
 - *i.* have achieved outstanding academic performance with a cumulative GPA (CGPA) of 3.0 or above:
 - ii. have achieved considerable commitment in community services;
 - iii. come from low income families or have proven financial needs such as successfully applied for Government grants and loans;
 - iv. have good conduct; and
 - v. preferably major in either one of the following disciplines:
 - Biomedical Sciences
 - Engineering
 - Economics & Finance
 - Mathematics
 - Computer Sciences

It is expected that half number of the annual award recipients should come from the abovementioned disciplines.

- 4. The Scholarships shall be open for application in September/October and the nominations shall be made by the Student Development Services in November. Vetting of the applications and allocation of the Scholarships shall be made by the Student Development Services.
- 5. A report on the Scholarships, summarizing the financial position of the fund and the list of recipients, will be submitted to the donor for information by the end of the academic year.

Remark:

With an objective to nurture our students and to promote caring culture, the University encourages each award recipient to make an annual donation of HK\$200 or more to the City University of Hong Kong for student support via CityU Alumni Giving Club when they are in employment after graduation. This term has been incorporated into all scholarship/prize/award/bursary schemes since February 2008.
