

Speaker Dr. Manuela Crasta

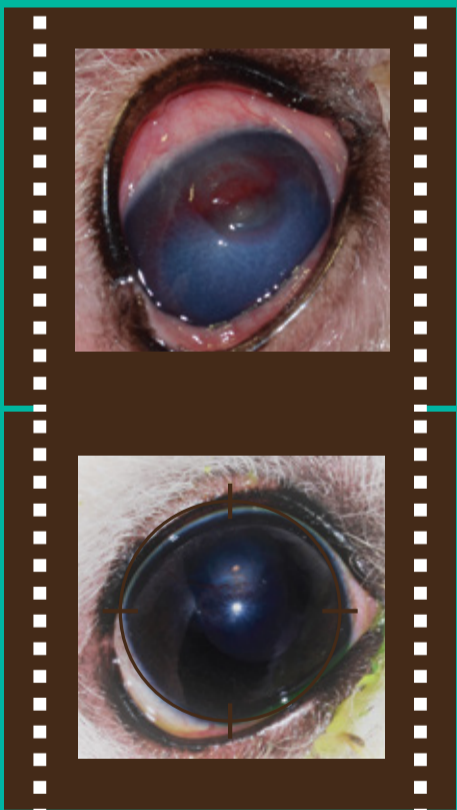

Dr. Crasta is a Diplomate of the European College of Veterinary Ophthalmologists, by examination, since 2011. In 2008 she received her PhD in Veterinary Ophthalmology. She completed her Residency in Ophthalmology at the Autonomous University of Barcelona and at North Carolina State University in the USA. She is a regular speaker at national and international Veterinary conferences and courses. Her special interests include: cataract surgery, corneal reconstruction surgery, retinal diseases and anything which can return vision to blind animals.



Corneal pathology:

Medical and surgical management, and the latest advances in both



The cornea, the clear outer layer of the front of the eye is commonly affected by multiple disease mechanisms, and can react to insults in different ways. Superficial corneal ulcers generally heal quickly and uneventfully, deeper ulcers are less predictable. Sometimes more aggressive therapy is necessary for deep ulcers, descemetocelles, iris prolapse and keratomalacia. It is vital to recognise corneal diseases early and to adopt the correct method of addressing corneal pathology in order to maintain corneal health and vision.

Dr. Crasta will address diagnosis of corneal disease, and the different methods of treating corneal diseases available in general and referral practice. She will cover medical therapy of corneal disease, and the latest in surgical techniques for maintenance or restoration of vision for the veterinary patient.
