# Associate Professor Wu Xuan (吳玄副教授) Shanghai Normal University

## <u>About the Speaker</u>

Professor Wu Xuan joined the Shanghai Normal University Law School (上海師範大學) as Associate Professor in 2019. He is also the Executive Director of the Institute of Network and Data Law and a research fellow of the Peking-Yale Joint Research Center for Law and Policy Reform (北大-耶魯法律與政

策改革聯合研究中心). Before coming to Shanghai, he was a senior research fellow at the Chinese Academy of Cyberspace Studies (CACS) and postdoctoral fellow at Tsinghua Law School. He received the Juris-Doctor degree from East China University of Political Science and Law. During 2011-2012, he studied Roman Law at University of Roma "Tor Vergata". He has been engaged in research on cyberspace law for a long time, and has participated in some legislation work, focusing on data cross-border, cyberspace security data governance and personal information protection.
