ELIGIBILITY

Submissions are invited from junior scholars on any topic that relates to Chinese Law, Comparative Law, or International Law. Junior scholars are encouraged to submit an abstract of an unpublished work, but we consider abstracts of recently published work too. There is NO requirement to submit a complete paper to the CCCL before or after the presentation.

Eligible applicants should be doctoral candidates, postdoctoral researchers, and full-time academic staffs (teaching and/or research) who have not held an academic position for more than 7 years.

SUBMISSION

The call for abstract for the Young Scholar Forum is currently open. We accept submissions on a rolling basis.
