Professor Rossi is a Assoc. Prof. in UiT The Arctic University of Norway. He has worked on the Psychology of Deterrence project at the Arms Control Association of the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace in Washington, D.C., on verification and public information issues for the United Nations International Atomic Energy Agency in Vienna, Austria, and as an assistant professor of international relations and American foreign policy at American University in Washington, D.C. In 1997-1998, he served as a director on the National Security Council in the Clinton White House in the office of Democracy, Human Rights and Humanitarian Affairs.

He is the author of five monographs on international law, most recently Sovereignty and Territorial Temptation (Cambridge UP, 2017), Whiggish International Law (Brill/Nijhoff, 2019), and Remoteness Reconsidered, The Atacama Desert and International Law (UMichigan Press, 2021).
