PROF, FREDERIC MEGRET

Frédéric Mégret is a Professor of Law and a William Dawson Scholar at McGill University. He held the Canada Research Chair on the Law of Human Rights and Legal Pluralism from 2006 to 2015. He was promoted to full professor in 2019. He was named codirector of the Centre for Human Rights and Legal Pluralism in 2021. In November 2022, Professor Mégret he received an honorary doctorate from the University of Copenhagen.

Dr. Wanshu Cong is a Global Academic Fellow at the Department of Law, HKU. Her research interests include theory and history of international law, critical legal studies and the intersection of law and technology. More recently, her work has been looking at transnational data governance by drawing from Marxist and Third World Approaches to International Law. During the Global Academic Fellowship, she will compare claims and practices of digital sovereignty by state and nonstate actors around the world and analyze them from a historical perspective.
