## About the Speaker

Randall Lesaffer (Bruges, 1968) studied law and history at the universities of Ghent and Leuven. From the later university, he obtained his PhD in Law on a study on early-modern and Cold War peace and alliance treaties. Lesaffer is professor of legal history at the KU Leuven and at Tilburg University. Since 2018, he is head of the Department of Roman Law and Legal History. He has been professor of legal history at Tilburg University since 1999, where he also served as dean of Tilburg Law School from 2008 and 2012. He is the founder of i-Hilt, Institute of the History of International Law@Tilburg

(www.historyofinternationallaw.org). He is editor-in-chief of the book series Studies in the History of International Law (Brill/Nijhoff) and editor of the Journal of the History of International Law (Brill/Nijhoff) as well as the Global Law Series (Cambridge University Press). He is general editor of the Cambridge History of International Law (13 volumes planned). Since 2015, he is president of the Grotiana Foundation.
