EXAMINING THE ENGLISH NECESSARY INTEREST RULE IN THE CHARITABLE TRUST SETTING

Speaker: Prof. JING Hui, University of Hong Kong

In England, Parliament introduced the necessary interest rule through the enactment of section 115 of the Charities Act 2011 (England and Wales), allowing 'any person interested' in a charitable trust to initiate charity proceedings against defaulting trustees in their administration of charitable assets.

In the presentation, Prof. Jing will, first, explain the ways in which the courts have interpreted the necessary interest rule and, secondly, discuss the theoretical implications of the necessary interest rule for understanding the conceptual nature of English express trusts.



Prof. Jing Hui is an Assistant Professor at the Department of Law, University of Hong Kong. Jing teaches and conducts research in equity and trust, contract, property, and charity law. He has published in journals including Legal Studies, the American Journal of Comparative Law, and the Journal of Equity, and he has contributed chapters to several edited collections.
