

7 July 2025 Professor Ding Chunyan Hosts Successful Academic Roundtables on AI, Tort Law, and Liability in Emerging Legal Challenges

The event brought together prominent legal scholars for in-depth discussions and scholarly exchanges, fostering collaboration and innovation within the field.

Among the distinguished speakers was Sara Migliorini from the University of Macau, who presented her paper on *AI-Powered Liability under EU Law*, exploring the implications of artificial intelligence in the context of European legal frameworks.

Isabel Mousinho de Figueiredo, also from the University of Macau, provided valuable insights into *Tort Law*, contributing to the broader understanding of this critical area of legal study.

Marta Infantino from the University of Trieste shared her work titled *Algorithmic Accidents as Mass Torts: Mass Litigation à la Européenne*, shedding light on the complexities of algorithmic accountability and its intersection with mass litigation in Europe.

Jodi Gardner from the University of Auckland discussed her paper, *Compensation for Fraud: Challenges of Proportionate Liability*, addressing the difficulties in achieving equitable outcomes in fraud cases.

Finally, Professor Chunyan Ding of the City University of Hong Kong contributed her expertise with a paper titled *Civil Liability for Automated Vehicle Accidents*, examining the legal frameworks needed to regulate the rapidly evolving field of autonomous vehicle technology.

Under Professor Ding's skilled guidance, the roundtables provided a dynamic platform for sharing insights and advancing research on key legal issues. This initiative further solidified the CCCL's role as a hub for cutting-edge legal scholarship and collaboration.
