International Investment Law in Times of Covid-19

1 June and 3 June 2020 (online)

How will (and should) international investment law (IIL) and investors, already under pressure for not taking adequate cognizance of investment-related human rights abuses and environmental pollution, respond to various (profit-reducing) measures taken by states to deal with Covid-19? Foreign investors, who bring in investment vital to promote economic development and realise human rights, have legitimate expectations to protect their rights. At the same time, states have legally binding obligations to respect, protect and fulfil all human rights. Has IIL been able to strike a balance in achieving these goals? Is IIL designed to facilitate inclusive and sustainable development? Has IIL exacerbated existing asymmetries between corporate investors and communities, including about access to justice? Does Covid-19 offer the global community an opportunity to rebuild a more equitable IIL?
