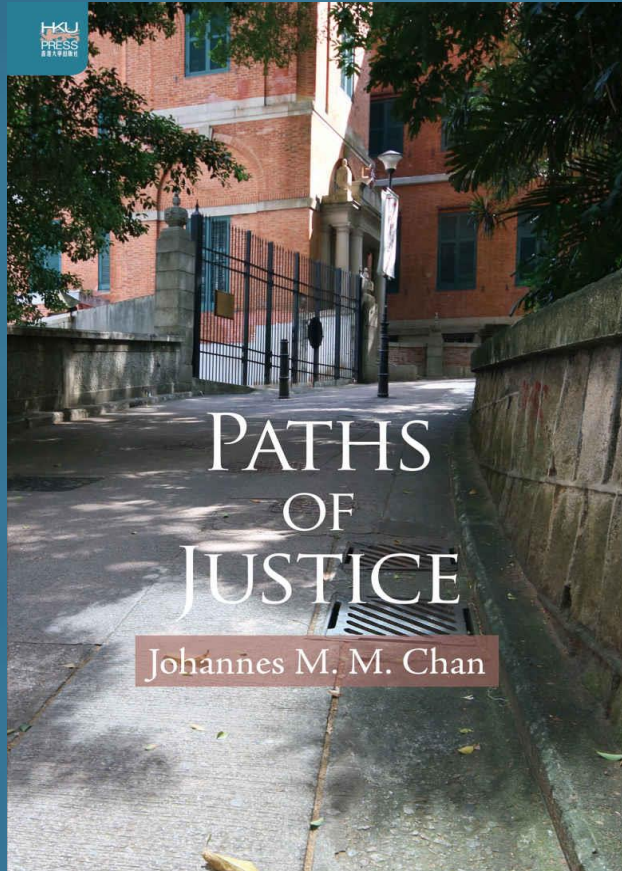

Prof. Johannes Chan SC is the Chair of Public Law of the Faculty of Law, University of Hong Kong. He specialises in human rights, constitutional and administrative law.

In *Paths of Justice*, Prof. Johannes Chan illuminates fundamental themes and basic values in Hong Kong's legal system by drawing upon his experience as a barrister and a scholar. He explains and demystifies some of the most frequently asked questions about the law: How does a lawyer defend someone who is guilty? Does the law favour the rich and the resourceful? Is there a duty to obey the law in all circumstances? How can human rights and national security coexist in balance if their goals conflict in certain situations? How can fairness be reconciled with administrative efficacy? Is an abuse of freedom a justification for denying it?
