



Notification on Emergency Response Unit (ERU) (26)

The University will operate as normal over the next two days from 8 to 9 October (Tuesday to Wednesday) until 6:00pm. Classes that start after 6:00pm will be cancelled. In view of the possible disruption to transport services during this time, we will exercise flexibility for those who arrive at work or class late.

For daytime classes, if any academic staff is unable to perform their scheduled teaching duties, they should ensure that make-up classes are properly arranged and inform all affected students as early as possible.

If students face difficulties getting to campus for classes, please inform individual teaching staff or course coordinators. If necessary, during the coming week, individual lecturers might upload lecture materials to Canvas for those who cannot come to the class.

The ERU will closely monitor the situation and respond accordingly. Students and staff should pay attention to the announcements and news about transport services and conditions.

Separately, we learned from the news that a CityU student appeared at court this morning after he was arrested two days ago. While the University urges students to be law-abiding, President Way Kuo and Professor Eric Chui, Dean of Students, approach CityU students arrested in the past to learn more about their situations.
